BIOHAZARDOUS BAG WASTE

Infectious materials (OPIM)

Blood tubing, bags,
hemovacs, pleurevacs

Blood soaked or dripping dressings

Contaminated waste

from isolation patients Suction canisters and liners with bodily fluids

BIOHAZARDOUS (SHARPS)

Needles

Glass slides, pipettes Scalpels

Bloody broken glass

Used sutures

Empty syringes

Trocars, introducers, catheters, electrocautery tips

CHEMOTHERAPY (TRACE)

Trace chemo waste of no more than 3% weight of original components All supplies used to make and administer chemo medication including sharps

including sharps
Examples: Tubing, empty bags/
bottles/vials, syringes, needles,
gloves, pads masks, gowns,
wipes, etc.

CYTOTOXIC & BIOHAZARD SYMBOLS

NON-HAZARDOUS PHARMACEUTICAL

NO SHARPS

Residual (pourable) meds

Discontinued IV bags/tubing

Partially used prescription or OTC medication

Examples: Vials, tablets, capsules, powders, contained liquids, creams/lotions, eyedrops, residual or wasted narcotics, unused narcotic patches

NON-HAZARDOUS PHARMACEUTICAL LABEL

HAZARDOUS PHARMACEUTICAL

NO SHARPS

RCRA Hazardous P and U-listed chemicals Examples: Inhalers, nitroglycerin tablets, unused acetone, bulk chemotherapy waste
